OFF CREEK STORAGE

One of the most talked about local issues from the last decade has been water security for Walcha. This has dropped off the radar in most conversations over the last 18 months, but Council has been hard at work in the background fitting the pieces together that will hopefully make water restrictions an issue from the past. Recently the final off creek storage design was presented to Council and we are now right to proceed with land purchase, document preparation and construction tendering. This has been a long and onerous process but the outcome is what matters and we are not guaranteed to build this storage. Obviously with the amount of civil works happening locally, state wide and nationally sees us in a competitive situation to engage contractors but we are hopeful that construction will start late this year.

It's one thing to build a dam, but as most people know it's another thing to fill it. We are capped on our yearly abstraction from Macdonald River and we still need to supply towns needs as we fill it. Compared to what we have been through this is certainly not an insurmountable problem and hopefully a few more wet seasons will see the storage full. After the drought, rules and regulations around water management and use seem to move around but hopefully we can obtain some concessions to fill it quickly. Start planting your trees now.

COVID

As it's well into the week of lockdown in Armidale and Tamworth now I won't cover the conditions that surround this lockdown and their impact on Walcha. These are easily found elsewhere and in more detail. Suffice to say that these are worrying times after the "break" we had as the first wave receded. It makes it clear that none of us are immune and this ever changing virus is only a train or car trip away from our community. Council, plus businesses and families in town are being severely effected by this and while some of the protocols around its containment can be arduous they are there for good reasons. I hope everyone stays safe and if you have concerns for neighbours etc and you or they are not too sure where to turn remember Council is only a phone call away. While we may not be able to solve the problem we will do everything possible to help. It's easy to criticize governments at this time but I believe that all leaders have shown tremendous courage and vision in this fight.
